Content of job information	<p>[Explanation of institution (recruitment background, institution details, explanation of project, etc.)]</p> <p>Waseda University's Global Center for Science and Engineering, in the Faculty of Science and Engineering seeks applicants for a full-time position teaching common core courses in mathematics/computer science, and teaching courses and supervising thesis research in undergraduate and graduate levels in the Computer Science and Communication Engineering major. In addition, he/she will be expected to carry out administrative duties related to the major.</p> <p>[Job details (duties, subject responsible for, etc.)]</p> <p>The successful candidate will teach the equivalent of at least 8 semester courses in English. A semester course meets one 90-minute session per week over 15 weeks. Among the 8 courses at least 4 must be common core courses offered to all students in the English-based degree program. Such courses include Linear Algebra (a two-semester course), Discrete Mathematics, Introduction to Probability and Statistics, Introduction to Programming, and a first-year science and engineering laboratory course. The remaining 4 courses will consist of undergraduate courses for the Computer Science and Communications Engineering Major and graduate courses. He/she may also supervise undergraduate and graduate research, but such supervision will not replace the responsibility to teach 4 common core courses. We seek applicants genuinely interested in the intellectual and personal growth of students,</p>

If this condition is not satisfied, the successful applicant will be appointed as a termed position.

	<p>Note 2:</p> <p>The termed appointment may be renewed for another two-year or less term by reevaluating his/her education, research and work performance at the end of the term. The appointment may be renewed further at the end of the next term. The total term as termed Professor or Associate Professor cannot exceed ten-year limit, however.
